The Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) Southern Region, Office of Pipeline Safety received correspondence from Columbia Gulf Transmission Company (Columbia Gulf) dated January 22, 2015, regarding the above referenced Corrective Action order (CAO). The CAO was issued after a February 13, 2014, incident on Columbia Gulf's Line 200 in Knifley, Adair County, Kentucky. The correspondence included the CAO Documentation Report (CDR) required by the CAO and a request to close the CAO.

The Southern Region has reviewed all the actions taken by Columbia Gulf with respect to the CAO and we find that Columbia Gulf has complied with the terms of the CAO. No further actions are necessary with regards to the CAO. This case is now closed. Accordingly, all pressure restrictions established by the CAO are withdrawn.

Please be advised that this letter refers only to the CAO (CPF 2-2014-1011H) and not to any other PHMSA pending cases, if any.
