

Dear Mr. Seeley:

During the weeks of September 10-14, September 24-26, and December 6, 2007 representatives of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) pursuant to Chapter 601 of 49 United States Code inspected the integrity management program (IMP) of ONEOK Partners, LP (ONEOK) for OkTex Pipeline, LLC (OkTex) in Tulsa, Oklahoma and El Paso, Texas.

ONEOK received a Notice of Amendment (NOA) letter on March 19, 2008 from PHMSA regarding apparent inadequacies found within ONEOK's IMP plans or procedures for OkTex. ONEOK respectfully accepts the Notice of Amendment and requests the response period be extended to July 31, 2008.

ONEOK is in the process of consolidating the integrity management program for OkTex with the integrity management program (Interstate IMP) for ONEOK's other interstate natural gas pipelines, which include; Guardian Pipeline, Midwestern Gas Transmission, and Viking Gas Transmission. The basis for the consolidated integrity management programs will be the Interstate IMP. An extension is requested to provide adequate time to fully complete and implement all activities associated with the consolidation, which include the following:

- Written plans and procedures of the Interstate IMP will be revised to incorporate the OkTex system and will include changes to address the inadequacies identified in the OkTex NOA letter. During the week of September 17-21, 2007 ONEOK made

several changes to the OkTex IMP as a proactive approach to address issues identified during the first week of the audit. All of these changes will be incorporated into the consolidated IMP plan and procedures.

- This consolidation effort also includes populating and integrating the OkTex data into the common data management systems and risk assessment model used to calculate high consequence areas and run risk for the Interstate IMP. This effort is well underway but additional time is required to achieve full use of the systems.

The consolidation of IMP plans, procedures, data management, and risk assessment systems will result in increased consistency and overall improvements to the pipeline integrity programs of ONEOK Partners' interstate natural gas pipelines. This consolidation will combine program enhancements gained through experience and knowledge of two PHMSA IMP audits. The Interstate IMP was audited during June 2006 by PHMSA. An NOA letter was issued by PHMSA in September 2006 and following submission of amended procedures in December 2006, a closing letter was issued by PHMSA in January 2007 accepting the IMP plan changes.

As stated above, ONEOK respectfully requests an extension in time until July 31, 2008 to complete full consolidation of the Interstate IMP program and submit amended procedures to PHMSA. ONEOK will provide both an electronic and hard copy of the written plan and procedures, as well as, a description of how each inadequacy identified in the NOA letter is addressed within the procedures.
