I am writing on behalf of Texas Gas Transmission, L.L.C. (hereinafter "Texas Gas") in response to your Notice of Probable Violation ("NOPV") and Proposed Civil Penalty dated December 19, 2012, which Texas Gas received on December 21, 2012, regarding an inspection of its Roanoke-Grand Chenier 20" pipeline near Grand Chenier, LA. The inspection was performed in response to a leak that occurred on the Roanoke-Grand Chenier 20" pipeline. The inspection was conducted on August 4, 2012.

Regarding Item 1, Texas Gas agrees to pay the above-referenced Proposed Civil Penalty and will not contest the NOPV. Accordingly, Texas Gas wired the payment on January 18, 2013.

Regarding Item 2, Texas Gas understands PHMSA's warning and will use the following action plan to address the warning:

- Texas Gas will revise its O&M procedures to specifically address low /no flow pipeline conditions as they relate to internal corrosion. We will consider in those procedures proper monitoring for internal corrosion.
- Texas Gas will re-evaluate its pipeline system to identify additional pipelines that may fall into the low/no flow pipeline condition.

Texas Gas recognizes the importance of pipeline safety and is taking actions to mitigate similar events in the future.
