Dear Mr. Barnum:

On August 17, 2009 to August 21, 2009, a representative of the State of Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission representing the U.S. Department of Transportation, Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), pursuant to Chapter 601 of 49 United States Code, inspected Chevron Texaco Pipeline Company's Pasco Pipeline System Operations and Maintenance (O&M) procedures. The review focused on O&M procedures related to the provers at the Fairchild and Spokane Delivery Stations. As a result of the inspection, Chevron was issued a Notice of Amendment on August 24, 2010, which proposed amendment of your procedures.

Chevron submitted its amended procedures on September 14, 2010. My staff and representatives of the Washington Utilities and Transportation Commission reviewed the amended procedures. It appears that the inadequacies outlined in this Notice of Amendment have been corrected.

This letter is to inform you no further action is necessary and this case is now closed. Thank you for your cooperation.
