Dear Mr. Gaglio:

On April 11, 2002, Columbia Gas Transmission Company (CGT), which is a subsidiary of NiSource Gas Transmission & Storage, was issued a Final Order in the above-referenced case that included a Compliance Order (CO). The CO was divided into two sections. Section A addressed the requirements pertaining to CGT's internal corrosion control program. Section B addressed requirements for pressure up-rating Line 18045 near Ellamore, West Virginia.

Please be advised you inadvertently referenced a Corrective Action Order (CAO) in your response letter dated April 29, 2011 to CPF# 1-2001-1002 rather than a CO. Notwithstanding the incorrect reference, you provided documentation and details demonstrating compliance with the requirements of the CO. Based on our detailed review of this documentation, our extended interaction with you as related field work was being conducted, and confirmation of payment of civil penalty, it has been determined that you have complied with the terms of this Order.

Accordingly, this case is now closed and no further action is contemplated with respect to the matters involved in this case.
