Thank you for your letter of September 12, 2007, requesting clarification of the original response submitted by Carolina Gas Transmission Corporation ("CGT") on June 18, 2007, to the Notice of Probable Violation and Proposed Compliance Order dated May 22, 2007 ("Notice"). This letter supplements CGT's *original* response to the Notice.

In its original response, CGT indicated that it would comply with the warning item and Proposed Compliance Order Items 1, 2, and 4 within 90 days of the Final Order. However, CGT requested an extension of time until December 31, 2007, in which to comply with Proposed Compliance Order Item 3. CGT requested a hearing only in the event that the request for extension of time to comply with Proposed Compliance Order Item 3 were denied.


In light of your September 12, 2007 letter, CGT does not request a hearing to discuss this case. CGT also does not contest any of the probable violations contained in the Notice. CGT intends to comply with Proposed Compliance Order Items 1, 2, and 4 within 90 days of the Final Order and to comply with Proposed Compliance Order Item 3 by December 31, 2007.
