Dear Mr. Valenzuela:

Between April 25 and 29, 2005, a representative from the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), pursuant to chapter 601 of 49 United States Code, conducted an on-site pipeline safety inspection of Rocky Mountain Pipeline System's (RMPS) procedures and records in Casper, Wyoming. As a result of the inspection, Rocky Mountain Pipeline System was issued a Notice of Probable Violation and Proposed Civil Penalty on December 15, 2005.

RMPS submitted its response to the Notice on October 2, 2006. This office reviewed the unusual circumstances associated with this case as presented by RMPS. It appears that RMPS self-identified a noncompliance issue and took prompt action to prevent its recurrence.

This letter is to inform you that PHMSA hereby withdraws the Notice, CPF 5-2005-5036, and this case is now closed. Thank you for your cooperation.
