This letter provides Alyeska Pipeline Service Company's (Alyeska) response to the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration's (PHMSA) Letter CPF 5-2019-5005W received on January 25, 2019.

In the letter, PHMSA states that Alyeska did not conduct an atmospheric corrosion inspection on Check Valve (CKV) 008 in the required three-year inspection interval for onshore facilities per 49 CFR 195.583(a).

Alyeska takes this finding seriously and is committed to performing inspections within the required inspection interval to ensure safe pipeline operations. The delinquent atmospheric corrosion inspection on CKV-008 was completed on March 3, 2018. Alyeska sent a summary of the inspection history that included 2015 computer radiography of primary and secondary valve bypass piping inspections and a timeline of events to PHMSA in Government Letter 39547, on April 9, 2018. In addition, Alyeska is implementing measures to strengthen internal controls and ensure that all time interval inspection requirements are met going forward.
