Dear Mr. Maret:

On January 29, 2021, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) issued to Olympic Pipeline Company a Notice of Probable Violation (NOPV) Final Order in the above-referenced case. This NOPV included two Compliance Order requirements:

- Item A: repair the dent on the 14-inch Portland Delivery Fuel W2 pipeline at site W2F-2016-003 with an allowable repair method
- Item B: interrupt all foreign rectifiers affecting the tank farm to determine if cathodic protection is adequate.

Based on our review of the documentation you provided in the August 5, 2021 and September 16, 2021 letters from Mr. Timothy Smith, it has been determined that you have complied with the terms of this Order.

Accordingly, this case is now closed, and no further action is contemplated with respect to the matters involved in this case. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
