Dear Mr. Cortez:

On July 16, 2019, the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA) issued a Corrective Action Order (CAO) to Phillips 66 Pipeline, LLC (Phillips 66) for the Line OK-01 rupture that occurred on July 10, 2019, near Thornberry, Texas. Line OK-01 transports crude oil between Wichita Falls, Texas and Ponca City, Oklahoma.

On November 2, 2022, Phillips 66 notified the Southwest Region office of completion of the Remedial Work Plan and requested closure of the CAO and restoring the pipeline to its pre-failure operating pressure. PHMSA monitored the actions taken within the Remedial Work Plan and reviewed records submitted by Phillips 66. PHMSA has determined that the operator has substantially completed the requirements of the CAO and that the pipe can safely be returned to pre-failure operating pressures.

Accordingly, this case is now closed, and no further action is contemplated with respect to the matters involved in this case. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
