From May through November 22, 2022, a representative of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), Office of Pipeline Safety (OPS), pursuant to Chapter 601 of 49 United States Code (U.S.C.) inspected Shell Pipeline Company, LP's (Shell) hazardous liquid pipeline systems in Texas, Louisiana, and the Gulf of Mexico. As a result of the inspection, ETC Shell was issued a Notice of Probable Violation (NOPV) of the Pipeline Safety Regulations, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations in the above-referenced case.

On September 11, 2024, PHMSA issued a Final Order in the above-referenced case. This Order included a Compliance Order and Civil Penalty. Based on our review of the documentation you provided and confirmation of payment of the civil penalty, it has been determined that Shell has complied with the terms of this Order.

Accordingly, this case is now closed, and no further action is contemplated with respect to the matters involved in this case. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
