Dear Mr. Long:

From June 6 through December 1, 2022, representatives of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), Office of Pipeline Safety (OPS), pursuant to Chapter 601 of 49 United States Code (U.S.C.) inspected Energy Transfer Company's (ETC) Mid-Valley pipeline operations in Michigan, Ohio, Kentucky, Tennessee, Mississippi, Louisiana, Arkansas, and Texas. As a result of the inspection, ETC Mid-Valley was issued a Notice of Probable Violation (NOPV) of the Pipeline Safety Regulations, Title 49, Code of Federal Regulations in the above-referenced case.

On September 11, 2024, PHMSA issued a Final Order in the above-referenced case. This Order included a Compliance Order. Based on PHMSA's review of the documentation provided on March 10, 2025, it has been determined that ETC Mid-Valley has complied with the terms of this Order.

Accordingly, this case is now closed, and no further action is contemplated with respect to the matters involved in this case. Thank you for your cooperation in this matter.
