From May 6 to May 8, 2024, a representative of the Pipeline and Hazardous Materials Safety Administration (PHMSA), pursuant to Chapter 601 of 49 United States Code (U.S.C.), inspected UGI Energy Services, LLC's (UGI) procedures for operating and maintaining its Temple liquefied natural gas (LNG) facility in Reading, Pennsylvania. As a result of the inspection, UGI was issued a Notice of Amendment on May 8, 2025, which proposed amendment of your procedures.

UGI submitted amended procedures in response to the Notice of Amendment on July 1, 2025. My staff has reviewed the amended procedures, and it appears that the inadequacies outlined in this Notice of Amendment have been corrected.
