Specific Objective(s) of the Agreement

Under this grant agreement, the recipient will:

Launch a statewide media campaign promoting first year legislation that will include approximately 3,700 radio messages, partnership with MS 811, and member utilities in a cable television campaign that will include 12,500 television commercials, 350,000 online messages, newspaper ads, and a targeted social media campaign.

Accomplishments for this period (Item 1 under Article IX, Section 9.01 Progress Report: "A comparison of actual accomplishments to the objectives established for the period.")

ELEMENT 1- EFFECTIVE COMMUNICATION

The goal of this project was to make the public and all stakeholders aware of the new element in the Mississippi Dig Law that allows for enforcement actions and penalties to anyone who violates the law. In an effort to reach as many people as possible, the MPSC worked with

MS811 and individual utilities to promote a statewide cable television and online ad campaign. The original estimate for ad placements was 12,500 commercials and 350,000 online messages. Due to greater participation than originally expected during the period of Jan. – July 2018, 2,688 bonus commercials were delivered across the state. During July 2018, a radio campaign, which included 3,700 radio messages, was used to promote the message. According to information provided by MS811, there has been a YTD increase of .45% in number of calls received and an increase of 5.5% in messages sent compared to 2017.

ELEMENT 4 - EFFECTIVE EMPLOYEE TRAINING

Enforcement of the new law requires operators/excavators that are in violation of the law to attend training. The goal of the training was to address the specific violation as much as possible. Online training for violators has been developed. This training was approved by the Enforcement Board and focuses solely on the current dig law. Violators are required to take such training (second violation) as required by law and administered by the Enforcement Board.

The Board believed that additional training (modular training) should be developed that focused on why stakeholders should follow the law (in addition to the obvious "it's the law".) The Board selected the following modules to be developed.

- A. Did not notify 811 before digging
- B. Did not locate within the allotted time
- C. Mechanical excavation within the marks
- 1. Later, the Board considered the possibility of making these (and other modules to follow) available to all stakeholders through a variety of media outlets (web, computer, etc.) without regard to violation in an effort to be more proactive as opposed to reactive.
 - i. The requirement was, even though they might be available for any stakeholder at any time, they could still be tracked through our software and that they could also be required training for repeat offenders in addition to already existing training.
- 2. The three modules have been approved, developed and tested to meet the requirements of the Board and available to educate all stakeholder groups about the personal and business advantages and disadvantages of following the law.
 - ii. Beginning in 2019, the Mississippi 811 Magazine and the Mississippi 811 Damage Prevention Managers will promote utilizing these and other training modules at tailgate and damage prevention meetings across the state.

ELEMENT 7 - ENFORCEMENT

Under 7.3, there were two key elements to be considered.

1. Development of an interactive, electronic form to capture all the required data necessary for the Board to use to make informed enforcement decisions such as required training and/or civil penalties for violators of Mississippi's dig law.

- a. The form is identified as the AVR form (Alleged Violation Reporting form.) An AVR logo was created with the approval of the Enforcement Board. The logo is provided to any stakeholder group in MS to include on their website if desired. Currently, the AVR form can be accessed on the MS811 website (ms811.org), the Enforcement Board's website (msdamageprevention.com) and the PSC website.
- b. The AVR went live in late 2017 and has been used throughout 2018 to collect data from any or all stakeholders in the state, including homeowners. In Mississippi, anyone can submit an AVR.
- 2. Create a database and process that can track violators' statistics, such as number of reported violations, penalties and other data as required and/or needed to generate reports for the Board to look for trends in alleged violations or alleged violations in geographical regions of the state and/or weaknesses in our current law or in the Board's rules and processes.
 - a. The AVR form has an associated database that has been linked to a master database for the Enforcement Board. The AVR that is submitted by an aggrieved stakeholder is received in real time by a representative of the Board. The process for handling the AVR from receipt to closure is clearly outlined in the rules adopted by the Board.
 - b. The Executive Secretary of the Board is responsible to attend Enforcement Board meetings and meets with the Executive Committee to review new submissions and meets with the entire Board to share reports generated at the request of the Board. This meeting generally is a discussion about repeat offenders (if any) and/or trends that might be noteworthy.
 - c. The reports are available at any time requested by the Enforcement Board.
 - d. Attached are a couple of reports that are typical of what the Enforcement Board might request.

Quantifiable Metrics/Measures of Effectiveness (Item 2 under Article IX, Section 9.01 Progress Report: "Where the output of the project can be quantified, a computation of the cost per unit of output.")

The metrics of data we are now collecting give us quantifiable information that will help us to identify trends in our damage prevention efforts in the State of Mississippi. The data is too new to identify trends now; however, as of November 30, 2018, we have received 380 Alleged Violation Reports, issued 77 citations and have 48 active cases.

Issues, Problems or Challenges (Item 3 under Article IX, Section 9.01 Progress Report: "The reasons for slippage if established objectives were not met.")

We were unable to complete the newspaper and social media campaigns due to timing of the funds and being unfamiliar with the requirements. We do not feel this has had an impact on the project. These funds are being returned.








